Paul M. Green passed from this life on Sunday, September 24, 2023, at his home on Monkey Island at the age of 96.

Paul was born on March 26, 1927, in Adair, OK to James Garfield Fillmore and Mattie Jane (Davis) Green. He joined the U.S. Army where he proudly served his country for 34 years both in active and reserve duty and retired in March of 1987, with the rank of E8 Master Sergeant. After retiring, Paul worked for Doss Aviation working at Fort Sill, OK and then transferring to Fort Belvoir, Virginia during Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm supporting the Airborne Electronics Research Detachment. Paul was instrumental in developing night vision technology.

In February of 1980, Paul married Ginger Edsall in Olathe, KS and the couple made their home in California.

The couple moved to the Grand Lake area from California in 1988. He soon joined the American Legion Post 178 where he served as past Commander and later became a member of the Grove Veterans Ritual Team, conducting over 100 funerals. He was surprised by Lee Cathey, the Commander at the time, with a van with his name on it showing he was a World War II Veteran. After retiring, Paul was never one to sit idle, so he began his own boat floater lift business and later went to work for Hydrohoist as their manager in Bernice, Oklahoma. After that, Paul was asked to be a caretaker on Monkey Island for four houses and 3 acres.

He enjoyed fishing and spent many hours doing so and enjoying the fruits of

his labor with many fish fries. Paul's many accomplishments include having his own body Shop, working as a farm hand, he was a welder and worked in the gold mines with his brother in Aiden Hills, California.

To know Paul, was to love Paul. Who could resist that ear-to-ear smile and the friendly hugs. He had the kindest soul and a generous nature, serving countless hours in the military, the American Legion and his community. Paul was a good man and a great friend. He was a leader and lead by example, always humble and kind. This world is a better place because Paul Green lived in it and he will be dearly missed.

He is preceded in death by his parents, his infant twin sister, brothers Johnny and Fred Green, sisters Opal Green, Martha Stroud, Alice Goss and grandson, Blaine Green.
