Richard Lee Bryant, affectionately known as Dick, passed away on May 18, 2025, at the age of 85 in Grove, Oklahoma. Born on June 24, 1939, in Ponca City, Oklahoma, he was a vibrant and outgoing individual who became a beloved figure in each of the various communities in which he lived.

Dick's early life was marked by his education at Ponca City High and further studies at Pittsburg State.

For many years, Dick dreamt of becoming - and passionately pursued - the career of a calf roper. He went on to proudly serve in the US Army Rangers, a testament to his dedication and resilience.

He began his professional career as a line printer for the Denver Post. He then advanced to Pennwell Printing as manager of the printing department.
