



## Ronald D Hammack

March 11, 1936 - September 1, 2025

Ronald D. Hammack, age 89, passed away on September 1, 2025, in Tulsa, Oklahoma. A lifelong resident of the rural Butler area, Ron was born on March 11, 1936, in Southwest City, Oklahoma.

A proud graduate of Grove High School's Class of 1952, Ron enlisted in the U.S. Army and proudly served during the Korean War. His service reflected the same quiet strength and sense of duty that he carried throughout his life. On July 4, 1966, Ron married the love of his life, Elizabeth "Betty" Mahi, at Butler Baptist Church in Jay, Ok.

He began his professional journey in the late 1950s as a warehouse manager for Sam Williams Wholesale—now known as Sports Center. His early career laid the foundation for a life defined by dedication and hard work. However, it was in farming and cattle ranching that Ron found his true calling. His deep connection to the land and livestock shaped not only his livelihood but also his identity.

Ron was an active figure in the agricultural communities of Southwest City and Afton. He played a pivotal role as an active member of the feed co-op in Afton and was a previous member of both the Southwest City Feed Coop and Cornerstone Bank. His contributions helped strengthen local farming infrastructure and supported generations of fellow farmers.

Faith was a cornerstone of Ronald's life. In 1950, he was one of the founding members of Butler Baptist Church—a spiritual home where he continued to worship faithfully for over seven decades.

Those who knew Ronald remember him as jolly yet reserved—a man whose quiet demeanor often gave way to moments of mischief and warmth. Friendly and steadfast, he left an indelible impression on all who crossed his path.

Ron was preceded in death by his parents, Glen and Lola (Harding) Hammack, wife, Betty Hammack, brother, Donald Wayne Hammack and sisters, Willa Jean and Glenna Faye.

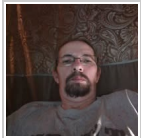
